EUROZONE crisis has integrated national and EU politics

THE issue: WHO should decide economic policy:

National governments OR the EU and the Troika?

Some say European integration should be pushed further.



Q. Some say European integration should be pushed further. Others say it has already gone too far. What is your opinion?




*21 countries: Median citizen satisfied as is; 5s a plurality

*Euro-fundamentalists: Create a European state


*Loyal followers: Support more integration due to cues from EU, some major parties

*For status quo-because satisfied or as the lesser evil to the risks of any change.

*Backing off: Would like less integration, withdrawal eurozone but not break up.


*National-fundamentalists: National withdrawal without regard for risks.
